The research maintains a strong gender and inclusion focus by targeting an equal distribution of male and female students and analyzing barriers for marginalized groups. This framework provides precise recommendations for curriculum updates and career services to help bridge the graduate unemployment gap.

The final output will be a validation into an Action Plan recommending targeted interventions to improve labor standards, enhance traceability, and align practices with the ILO Decent Work Framework.
